

Board of Canvassers Meeting August 17, 2012

Village Clerk, Christopher A. Haltom, met with members Lynn Kobus and Brenda Hnilicka at 11:45am on August 17, 2012.

The board noted all absentee ballots are mailed to the village's post office box and that the post office processes all mail by 8:30am each day. Based on this fact, the board decided to meet at 11:45am rather than wait until after 4pm.

The board noted four absentee ballots were available for counting as late ballots. Three of these ballots had been received by the village prior to the Election Day but were omitted from the Election Day counting. These votes will be counted as late ballots. There was one ballot that arrived after the election and the board noted the postmark was after August 14, 2012 so the ballot was rejected.

Board member Brenda Hnilicka spent several hours inputting the information from the Eagle voting machine tapes into an Excel spreadsheet in order to obtain the proper vote counts for each race included on the August 14, 2012 primary election. C. Haltom and L. Kobus verified the accuracy of the summary prepared by B. Hnilicka and made any necessary changes. The summary of these votes are attached to this document and included as part of these minutes. The count was modified to include the 3 votes counted as arriving late.
