Summary:

Cats Anonymous 2010 grant from PetSmart Charities in the amount of \$3,147.00 for TNR program in Howard/Suamico extended through August 2011. Village of Howard saves over \$100.00 per cat (feral/semi-feral) that is handled through the TNR program versus taken to the animal shelter.

Part-time animal pick-up person hired to cover periods when Animal Control Officer is not available, instead of having sheriff's deputies handling transport of animals.

Slight drop in licenses sold in 2010. Increasing the number of dogs and cats licensed will be a 2011 priority.
