The Howard-Suamico School District is positioned in one of the most popular and fast growing areas of Wisconsin. 

# REFUSE & RECYCLING

## 1. Garbage Cart (60 gallon)

- To the curb by 6:00 a.m.
- Set garbage container on opposite side of driveway than the recycle container and leave a 5-foot radius from any obstacles (e.g. mailbox, trees, cars, etc.)
- DO NOT stuff the cart or it may not empty.
- Call 434-4060 at least 24-hours before your scheduled day of pickup, if you occasionally have garbage bags that will not fit in your cart.
- A 90-gallon cart is available at \$25.00 per year in replacement of the 60-gallon cart.
- The cart stays with the address.
- Any damage to the cart, please call 434-4060.

## 2. Recycling is EVERY OTHER WEEK on your garbage day.

- Each recycling container costs \$45.62. You may return your recycle container and get reimbursed if you move out of the Village of Howard.
- You may purchase another recycle container for \$45.62 and a yearly fee of \$15.00.
- Set recycle container on opposite side of driveway than the garbage container and leave a 5-foot radius from any obstacles (e.g. mailbox, trees, cars, etc.)
- The village uses a single-stream recycling process. Paper, plastic, glass and cans go together in the recycle container.
- DO NOT stuff the cart or it may not empty.
- Any damage to the cart, please call 434-4060.

## 3. Tuesday Special Garbage pickup for larger items (furniture, mattress, etc.).

- Call in by 3:00 p.m. Monday to 434-4060.
- On nights or weekends leave a message on the answering machine (Press 6).
- If you have an item that contains Freon, a fee of \$15.00 is charged before the item will be picked up. Stop at either the Village Hall or Public Works building to pay the fee.
- Things that will not be picked up are: regular garbage, recyclables, toxic waste, tires, concrete, asphalt, shingles or contractors' construction materials.

## 4. Tuesday Brush Pickup

- Call in by 3:00 p.m. Monday to 434-4060.
- On nights or weekends leave message on the answering machine (Press 5).
- Branch collection is suspended from November through early April of each year.
- Largest diameter of branch is 6". The branches should be stacked neatly at the curb with the butt ends facing the street. If the branches extend over the sidewalk then the branches need to be placed perpendicular to the curb with the butt ends to the left as facing the house. If neither of these procedures is followed the brush will not be picked up.
- Curbside collection of Christmas Trees will be done in January of each year.
- All other branches and yard waste may be dumped at the 24/7 yard waste site at the Public Works Facility, 1336 Cornell Road. There is no charge for this service.


## 5. Free 24/7 Electronics Recycling

- Electronics, appliances, office machinery and nearly anything else with a plug can be brought to the 24/7 Electronics Recycling Area at the Public Works Facility, 1336 Cornell Road.

## 6. Yard Waste

- Picked up at the curb in the Spring and Fall (Collection schedule is posted on [www.villageofhoward.com](http://www.villageofhoward.com))
- Yard waste also may be dumped at the Public Works Facility, 1336 Cornell Road.
- Grass, leaves, garden waste, sod, branches, shrubs, logs, corn stocks and bales of hay can be dumped into the yard waste pile.

## 7. Free to Village residents at the Public Works Facility located at 1336 Cornell Road

- Wood chips and Compost/Mulch

### To Ensure that Recycling is Collected, Please Follow Steps Below:

- Recycling occurs every two weeks on the same day as garbage collection.
- The recycling bin located at your address remains at that location if you move to another residence.
- You may purchase another recycle container for \$45.62 and a yearly fee of \$15.00.

### Plastic

- Containers must be clean before put in bins.
- All bottles, plastic tubs and other containers coded #1 or #2 (except automotive bottles) can be recycled. Remove caps and lids.
- Plastic coded #3 through #7 (Including Plastic Bags) **CANNOT BE RECYCLED.**

### Glass

- Clean glass bottles and jars.
- Keep all bottles and jars whole.
- No dinnerware glasses or window glass.

### Metals

- Put steel or bi-metal cans with glass and plastic.
- Only clean food cans.
- Scrap steel - call Public Works for special pick-up.

### Paper

- Flatten cardboard boxes - must be 2' x 2' or smaller.
- No paper milk or juice cartons.

**The Village of Howard uses a single-stream recycling system. All recyclable materials can be mixed together in the recycling bin!**

### **DID YOU KNOW?**





# ANIMAL CONTROL



Humane Officer, Monica Hoff

Monica Hoff is Howard's Animal Control/Humane Officer. She can be contacted by calling (920) 819-6709.

If you notice a stray or wild animal that is out of control and causing harm to people or property, please contact Ms. Hoff immediately. If she cannot be reached by phone, contact the Brown County Sheriff Department at (920) 391-7450.

## Pet Regulations

- Pets shall not run at large (must be kept on leash)
- Clean up pet waste
- Habitual barking, howling, etc. is considered a public nuisance
- No more than two dogs allowed on one property unless a kennel license is obtained

## Licenses

All dogs and cats must be licensed annually in the Village of Howard prior to April 1st. Dog licenses require proof of rabies vaccination.

### DOG/CAT LICENSING

Pursuant to Section 4-49 of the Howard Municipal Code, LICENSING OF DOGS AND CATS IS REQUIRED prior to April first of each year. Please complete the licensing information below, and mail along with the appropriate fee and proof of rabies shot, as well as spay/neuter verification to the Village of Howard, P.O. Box 12207, Green Bay, WI 54307-2207. (Please request if you want proof of rabies shot sent back to you.)

License Fee: Spayed/Neutered \$5.00 per dog/cat ---Not Spayed/Not Neutered \$30.00 per dog/cat. \$5.00 penalty if not licensed by April 1<sup>st</sup>.

Kennel License is required for 3 or more dogs, Kennel License applications are available at the Village Hall - 434-4640.

Kennel License Fee - \$25.00 - plus License Fee for each animal.

# PARKS

The Village of Howard has 21 parks and natural areas spanning hundreds of acres that provide excellent opportunities for recreation, relaxation and family fun. Howard's Memorial Park is the trail head of the Mountain Bay Trail which runs through three counties in northeast Wisconsin and is 83 miles long (6 miles in Brown County).

Akzo Nobel Sports Complex (pictured below) is a premiere recreation facility that features four lighted softball diamonds, ten soccer fields and an 18-hole disc golf course (below left). Various softball and soccer tournaments are held at our park throughout the summer.



Meadowbrook Park is a 92-acre major outdoor recreation area. It consists of a paved 1.25-mile trail, gently sloping open areas, wooded lowlands, wetlands and hills. The park also features a playground, a lighted sledding hill, a fully-fenced baseball diamond, a full-size basketball court, an open air shelter, and an enclosed pavilion with kitchen and restrooms.

The Village of Howard also operates Village Green Golf Course. This nine-hole municipal, par 36 golf course presents a challenge to experienced golfers while providing an opportunity for beginners to learn the game as well.


